they would abstain from voting on the bill. That means they don't vote yes or no. And that may just be enough to win. Okay, ladies and gentlemen at this time I really don't have anything else to add. Warm weather is coming so get your bikes ready and I hope everybody is going to have a good time this year. I notice that charters are starting to get their events in order so let's have a good year. And will see you on the road. Ride safe be free.



MRF State Rep Report –

*“Unless commitment is made, there are only promises and hopes... but no plans.”
– Peter Drucker.*

Thirty-some years ago, I joined a new organization I had been hearing about. Although I had been active in ABATE for several years, I knew we had a weak spot. As a State-based organization, we had little influence on federal regulations affecting motorcycles. The actions taken in Washington DC, both the good and the bad, will affect us here at the State level. This new organization, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation, was the answer we needed to that problem. I was excited to commit myself to that effort. And now, all these years later, the MRF continues to be a strong effective voice for motorcyclists in Washington DC. The MRFs effectiveness comes from the strength of its members. The State ABATE organizations, the local ABATE charters, the sustaining membership clubs, and most importantly the many individual members, all provide the MRF with the resources needed to fight for our freedoms on a federal level. These resources include the membership dues we all pay to keep the organization running. The letters and emails we send when requested to respond to an upcoming bill in Congress and the numbers of our membership and motorcyclists that we represent. It can make a big impact when the MRF meets with a legislator and tells them how many motorcyclists they represent, especially how many in their legislative district.

But this effectiveness is lost without our membership. Without the support of the MRF members there would be no money to send out our newsletter, there would be no letters and emails to the legislators to convince them to support our legislative priorities, and there would be no claim to represent the interests of their constituents. The federal government, the Department of Transportation, the EPA, and all the rest of the regulatory agencies would never even think about motorcyclists as new rules are passed that limit our right to ride, or outlaw us altogether.

The good news is that MRF membership here in Tennessee has been increasing over the past few years. But that growth has been agonizingly slow, and the MRF membership represents only a fraction of our CMT/ABATE membership. And several of our local charters have let their annual sustaining organization membership lapse. This weakens the MRF position in DC, and can detract from our ability to positively influence federal legislation.

There are several goals that I strongly believe in:

- Every motorcyclist in Tennessee should be a member of CMT/ABATE.
 - Every CMT/ABATE member should also be a member of the MRF.
 - Every CMT/ABATE Charter should be a Sustaining Member of the MRF.
- And don't forget, your clubs, riding groups or local businesses can also support both CMT/ABATE and the MRF.

I realize these are some very aggressive goals, and I understand that some

members and organizations really can not afford this or may not value their freedom to ride in the same manner that I do. So let's start a little smaller – with YOU. Are YOU a member of the MRF? Is YOUR CHARTER a Sustaining Member Organization? If we start there, and build on it, we just might approach those goals above, and every step forward increases our ability to affect the decisions made in our legislature. Imagine the influence we could wield if we reached these goals. With the commitment of every motorcyclist in Tennessee, we could move beyond hope, and build a plan to virtually guarantee our future ability to...



The MRF pushes back on EPA about Current Ethanol Labeling Requirements March 16, 2021

This week the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) joined other national groups in pushing back on proposed rule changes to current ethanol labeling requirements. Representatives of manufacturers, suppliers, and consumers of boats, motorcycles, off-road vehicles, and outdoor power equipment made clear that elimination or changes to current E-15 labels at fuel pumps would cause irreparable harm to millions of consumers.

In a letter to the new head of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Administrator Michael Regan, the group stated that, "The misfuelling of marine engines and vessels, motorcycles, off-road vehicles, and outdoor power equipment places significant burdens on both the American consumer and product manu-

facturers. The risk to consumers is that they will experience product damage, compromised performance and emissions requirements, economic loss, and fuel leaks resulting in unsafe products."

As a reminder, in January the EPA proposed elimination of the current E15 label altogether or the significant changes listed below:

- Removing the "Attention" stripe along the upper right corner of the label.
- Removing the phrase "E15" from the label, while including the language "contains up to 15% percent ethanol".
- Revising the language "Use only in" to "Safe for use in".
- Revising the language "Don't use in" to "Avoid use in".
- Revising the format of the word "prohibited" such that it is not in bold and italicized type.

The MRF has long advocated consumer education to combat the increased prevalence of E15 nationwide. The letter to EPA points out that a recent survey shows, "Three in five consumers mistakenly assume E15 is safe for all their products."

Additionally, consumers should be aware that many manufacturer warranties are voided if improper fuel is used.

The MRF thanks the diverse set of partners that have worked together on this issue. Other signatories of the letter include the American Motorcyclist Association, American Sportfishing Association, Boat Owners Association of the United States, Briggs & Stratton, Marine Retailers Association of the Americas, Motorcycle Industry Council, National Marine Manufacturers Association, Outdoor Power Equipment Institute, Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle Association, Special Vehicle Institute of America and the Truck and Engine Manufacturers Association.

MRF President, Kirk "Hardtail" Willard said, "Whether it be the boat guys, the chainsaw guys or the flying cars guys, the MRF will work with almost anyone when our interests are aligned."






