
Perhaps the most important of the plans made at the Meeting of the Minds is the MRF Legislative Agenda for the coming year. This is definitely **NOT** a listing of what the MRF legislative team wants to do. Instead, representatives from all of the States in attendance sit down to review last year's priorities, and determine what the MRF needs to work on over the next year. This provides direction for the MRF, and sets priorities for what they really need to work on, what would be nice to accomplish, and what we need to keep an eye on. I have included the details of the MRF legislative agenda in a separate article, and it will also be included in the next issue of the American Bikers Journal, which is one of your benefits as an MRF member (you ARE a member aren't you?).

This is also a good time for us to make plans for the future for CMT/ABATE and our local charters. An important part of that planning is the legislative update session that we have begun holding on the afternoon of our annual New Years Kick-Off party. This is currently planned for January (assuming COVID-19 doesn't



force a change to that). If you can attend, it has been a very informative session in the past, and that way you'll already be there when the party starts.



NEWS & EVENTS (MARK YOUR CALENDARS)

Legislative Agenda set during Meeting of the Minds 2020

One of the most important events at Meeting of the Minds is the legislative strategy session. Each year, during this session, State motorcycle rights groups develop the federal legislative priorities for the following year. Items are discussed, debated and eventually voted on, with each Sustaining State Motorcyclists' Rights Organization (SSMRO) having a voice and a vote. Legislative priorities are placed in one of three categories, "High," "Medium" and "Monitor". These priorities will serve as a roadmap, for the Motorcycle Riders Foundation Washington D.C. team, as we focus on 2021.

While you can see the full detailed list of priorities in the next American Bikers' Journal, below is brief preview of the "High" priority items approved during the session.

- Profiling: Continue pursuit of the House anti-profiling resolution mirroring the Senate version that passed unanimously. Build momentum for inclusion of anti-profiling language in other legislation.
- Renewable Fuels: Advocate for targeted changes to the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS).
- Autonomous Vehicles: Advocate and monitor any legislation or regulations related to motorcycles concerning connected and autonomous vehicles.
- Emission Regulations: Engage the EPA & Congress on any activity related to motorcycle emission regulations.
- Definition of a Motorcycle: Educate policymakers and advocate for change to current definition, that better reflects the current two- and three-wheel motorcycle landscape.
- Crash Avoidance: Continue to promote the theme of crash avoidance versus safer crashing urging NHTSA and the DOT to focus on crash prevention and rider education.
- Helmet Laws: Oppose any mandatory federal helmet, apparel or conspicuity standards.
- Black Box: Pursue legislative language that any collected or available vehicle data is the property of the consumer and in which the consumer has the choice to opt-out of having their personal data communicated to interested parties.
- Surface Transportation Reauthorization (Highway Bill): Advocate and pursue legislative efforts that impact motorcyclists in the Highway Bill, now set to expire in 2021.

We attended several of the workshops at least as many as we could in two days time. We came back with our heads full of ideas spilling over. Not to mention numerous pages of notes.

To sit and talk with others and learn what they have tried and what has succeeded with growing their memberships, and sustaining them. It gives us thoughts on how we can implement some of those here.

On a Federal level the biggest bill that is in the works is H.Res 255. This is the bill against anti-profiling resolution. If it does not pass by January 2, 2021, it will have to be re-introduced. All the co-sponsors we currently have on this bill will automatically be on the one if we have to re-introduce it.

It all comes down to one thing, "AWARENESS". Sharing the information and taking a stand. Profiling is a huge problem for all riders and individuals. Remember to always use the "3 R's;

RIDE-RECORD-REPORT all profiling.

The MRF plans to work with the appropriate stake holders concerning the federal definition of a motorcycle. Ensuring that crash and fatality statistics continue to be separate from other types of vehicles. To not blame a fatality stating "they weren't wearing a helmet", or " they were traveling at a high rate of speed". Facts, TRUE FACTS need to be stated. If a biker dies because a car hit them, lets stop brushing it off. The driver always claims "I didn't see them", or "they came out of nowhere flying". What do they receive you may ask? In most cases not even a ticket, it is excused because it was a motorcycle. Let's fight for stricter laws and not brushing it under the rug. Let's fight for our lost brother or sister who lost their life. Let's fight for the family that they left behind.

While attending the workshop on profiling I first learned of the "WACO" incident. Larry knew of the story but I couldn't recall of every hearing about it. We

were attending "Bridging the gap Clubs/SMRO". This was held by two awesome men, Paul Landers and Russell Radke. During this workshop Paul Landers touched on the "Waco" incident. We found ourselves spellbound and with the fact, no this couldn't happen in our country. It was decided that that he would speak in more detail in the next workshop giving more indepth details. So, yes we chose to attend to be more educated on the subject. Paul Landers was there and was one who was arrested and detained. He lost so much because, they were being profiled!! Paul dedicates his life for fighting for motorcyclist rights. If you ever get the chance to hear these two men speak, do so. It will change your life.
